### Timeline of Key Events

1945: The United Nations Economic and Social Council, or ECOSOC, was formed and its purpose was to discuss international economic and social issues and create international solutions.

1948: The United Nations Department of Economic and Social Affairs is formed in order to find ways to introduce and promote sustainable development for countries around the world.

2003: DESA wrote The United Nations Guidelines for Consumer Protection which was a guide to help protect consumers from predatory company practices which tried to help prevent over purchasing and inadvertently cause less waste from products bought by consumers.

2015: The Youth-led Sustainable Community Development was created by DESA in order to help reach the SDG's by 2030 and was a project lead by youth around the world to help promote international sustainability which included protecting nature and also finding pollution through things such as factories, over-production, and mass consumerism.

2019: Around 180 countries reached a deal that aims to sharply reduce the amount of plastic that gets washed into the world's oceans.
